**Ernest Despres** 1928 – 2023

Ernest Joseph Despres, 95 of Residence Au Bénaise and formerly of Moncton passed away Tuesday, October 31, 2023 at the Dr. Georges L. Dumont Hospital.

Born in Cocagne, he was the son of the late Alphonse Despres and Laura (Mazerolle) Despres. Ernest worked at Assumption Life for 34 years, retiring as a purchasing manager.

Ernest began to play the fiddle while still a teenager and his natural talent would also take him to the guitar, mandolin and later the drums. In 1955 he married Jeanine Arsenault, a Cathedral organist and choir director. They formed a band in 1957 called Les Gais Mariniers specializing in old time favourites and Latin American tunes to play dance halls and other venues. Then in 1960, Ernest formed another band, the Ercolle Catalli. Other music alliances followed in which Ernest played drums and percussion, as well as fiddle. These included the Crescendos from 1962-1977 and Strings and Keys from 1990-1996. Ernest taught violin for about 25 years to a wide variety of individuals and on October 13, 2007 he was inducted in the New Brunswick Country Music Hall of Fame.

After retiring from his day job in 1983, he opened a studio to teach violin, note reading and tablature, as well as mandolin and guitar and in 1991, he founded the Greater Moncton Fiddlers.

Ernest enjoyed staying busy and that once included painting and woodcarving.

He is survived by his daughter Ginette Despres; grandchildren Mathew, Melyssa and Thomas Lake, Brandon Sellers and Kathleen Despres; sister Maria Belliveau (Henri). Predeceased by his beloved wife Jeannine; son Terrance Despres; daughter Jocelyne Despres and sisters Alphonsine and Andréa.

A Celebration of Ernest's Life, Kitchen Party Style will be held at a later date. Arrangements are in the care of Salisbury Funeral Home (506-372-4800). Private interment at Fair Haven Memorial Gardens.

If desired, donations to the Canadian Cancer Society or Alzheimers Society would be appreciated by the family.

Vivian and I served on the Board and in other capacities since 1995 and have decided it was time to pass on the torch to very capable hands. We do wish to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their support, encouragement and efforts over these years in keeping Aubrey Hanson's dream alive and making sure this successfully carries on into the future.

We offer sincere congratulations to Reg Gallant, the new President of our Hall of Fame! We ask all members to give full support to Reg and Linda. Vivian and I will be there when there are occasions that we may be able to give a helping hand with.

Like many musicians in New Brunswick at this time of year, we are doing our share of Christmas events, including an appearance on the CTV Christmas Daddies Telethon (Dec 2 from 11am to 6pm), playing at senior homes and concerts and if anyone is interested in attending a fiddle doo, then take in one at the Lions Hall on Peter Street in Salisbury NB, Saturday, December 9 from 1:30pm to 4:30pm. 
